REGISTER NOW

St. Mel's Office of Faith Formation oversees the St. Mel School of Religion Program which provides Religious Instruction to children in grades 1 through 8 who attend public schools.

Through our Religious Education program, we seek to increase children's awareness of the presence of God in their daily lives through Scripture, prayer and an age-appropriate curriculum. The program also prepares the children to complete their initiation into the Catholic Church through the Sacraments of Penance/First Communion and Confirmation.

Classes are held on Wednesdays from 3:30 pm to 5:00 pm for Grades 1-5 and from 6:30 pm to 8:00 pm for Grades 6-8.

If you haven't already, new and returning students should register for the 2024-2025 school year as soon as possible by completing the on-line registration form at: https://stmels-queens.org/religious-education. The tuition fee for the 2024-2025 school year is \$150 for one child, \$200 for two children and \$225 for three or more children. Tuition can be paid through one of the following three options:

Eucharistic Devotions –

EGERIA INSERTS

Enrichment and Fruitfulness

While much of Eucharistic devotion is private and personal, there is also a public aspect that has developed over the centuries. While present in the early Church, particularly in Jerusalem as recounted by Egeria, it grew even larger in post-Reformation Europe, where the faithful wished to show off their belief in the divine presence in the Holy Eucharist.

This demonstration took the form of outdoor processions with the Blessed Sacrament, beginning in France around 1250, then spreading to other localities. Taking place originally on the Feast of Corpus Christi (Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ), these processions extended to parish/village feasts, the installation of a new bishop or pastor, or in thanksgiving for blessing/graces received. After the Reformation, it also served to reaffirm belief in the Real Presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist.

The forty hours devotion, begun in Italy around 1530, is another manifestation of Eucharistic devotion. Its continuous nature not only bears witness to Christ in the sacrament but also allows for a penitential aspect as adorers watch and pray through the night.

Additional celebrations may also become more "solemn" when associated with Eucharistic adoration and benediction: not only the local celebrations mentioned above but also evening prayer (vespers) on Easter, the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart, and Christ the King, as well as in connection with the Divine Mercy devotion.
